Rules

1. Get into 4 teams.
2. The *Facilitator* will assign each team to study a specific champion listed in Hebrews 11 – the “Heroes Hall of Fame.”
3. Each team is to study their hero and prepare a report to the large group on the following three questions:
 - a. Who was this person?
 - b. What did the person do that made them a champion?
 - c. How did this champion impact the Biblical history?
4. Listed below are the champions. Use the concordance in your Bibles to find the details of their stories.
 - a. Enoch (Hebrews 11:5-6)
 - b. Noah (Hebrews 11:7)
 - c. Joseph (Hebrews 11:22)
 - d. Rahab (Hebrews 11:31)

Facilitator:

Students will need their Bibles for this activity. This is a team research activity and an exercise in effective leadership. To accomplish the task the team must divide up the work. Give the teams 5 minutes and then have each group report to the large group.
