



Circle of Uniqueness Initiative

Initiatives can be a great way to improve team unity and strength. They help students work together, communicate with one another, and learn more about their role within the team. This initiative allows students to learn about one another and how God has wired them. Students will share with each other the things that make them unique – the facilitator should provide a definition -- and examples -- of unique attributes. Encourage team members to listen actively to what makes their peers unique in the Kingdom of God.

Instructions:

1. Form two circles for the initiative "Circle of Uniqueness."
2. The person whose last name is closest to the end of the alphabet begins by answering the question: *"What is one thing that makes you unique?"*
3. Go around the circle clockwise with each person giving one answer to the question.
4. Continue around the circle sharing answers as many times as possible.
5. If you run out of answers you say, "Pass."
6. The winner is the team with people still answering the question when the Facilitator calls time.

Facilitator's Note:

There should really be no clear winner in this game – every team member has many attributes that make him/her unique!

Debriefing Questions:

1. What are some things that you learned about your team members?
2. Why do you think God gives each of us unique abilities and gifts? What does that accomplish for God's Kingdom?
